Especially if I am somehow involved! You’d better know the phone number and shortest route to the trauma center!

Now (#3) the GOOD NEWS! You can call your very friendly New York Rural Water Association Circuit Rider who will happily assist you if need be to achieve this Rural Development request. They, (RD) and I, have been very patient BUT, it has been a looong time since 11/7/06 now hasn’t it? It is your security and safety we are concerned about, you must be also.
