The NYS Department of Health continued their partnership with the NYRWA on a 5-year technical assistance contract which kicked off October 1, 2018, and runs through July 31, 2023. This contract provides for (2) Technical Assistance Providers to assist small water systems, both public and private, with on-site technical assistance and training to maintain compliance.

Under this contract, we are equipped to provide a wide variety of assistance including leak detection, line locating, treatment troubleshooting, uni-directional flushing, rules and regulations education, standard operating plans, emergency response plan updates, and vulnerability assessment updates just to mention a few. We are here to assist at your request, and will respond to all requests in a timely fashion.

By working together with water system personnel and using the equipment that has been provided by NYRWA, we have been very successful in helping water systems resolve issues and remain in compliance, serving the needs and demands of both their consumers and the regulatory agencies. We also have a strong support network with our Associate Members, experts in various fields and technologies who can be relied upon when issues need resolution. This partnership with our Associate
